LEARNING AND TEACHING

The focus of the Learning and Teaching committee is to progress and maximise student outcomes through active engagement, student voice and professional learning. This year we focused on Artificial Intelligence (AI) in Learning and Teaching and Teacher Peer Observation (TPO). Al in education holds immense potential to transform the educational landscape, making learning more personalised, efficient, and engaging. TPO allows teachers to observe each other in the classroom and to share ideas and methodologies to implement in their own teaching. This promotes a culture of professional learning allowing teachers to improve their practice to enhance student learning.

A number of foreign research trips were undertaken by teachers during the academic year funded by the Erasmus+ Mobility programme. In Finland, our research project focused on the impact of Effective Questioning and student voice on the overall academic progress and wellbeing of students. In the Netherlands, our research focused on investigating the effective use of peer observation in the Dutch education system. Finally, in the Netherlands and Germany, staff members observed and shared best practice in relation to learning and teaching strategies.

NOTRE DAME UNIVERSITY VISIT TO CBC

CBC was delighted to welcome Ms Erin Camilleri, Director of Recruitment and Strategic Partnerships at the University of Notre Dame, USA to the College. Ms Camilleri made a presentation to students about academic scholarship opportunities under the US system and at Notre Dame University, in particular. Past pupil Ben Warren Flynn is currently a student at Notre Dame and participated in a summer programme at University of California, Berkeley,



MATHS SUCCESS

This past year was characterised by outstanding success in the field of Maths.

In First Year, Max Dietze and John Murphy were presented with Outstanding Achievement and Merit awards by the Irish Maths Teachers Association (IMTA) for their exceptional performance in the First Year Maths Problem Solving Competition.

Aaron Sidhu was also recognised by the IMTA at the inaugural Maggie Gough Maths Competition. Aaron was one of the top 55 students from almost 19,000 students whose outstanding achievement in the competition was acknowledged.

Fionn Kimber O'Shea enjoyed extraordinary success

through his involvement in a number of Maths Olympiads and international competitions. Fionn won the Irish Maths Olympiad for the third year running and captained the Irish Team in the International Maths Olympiad. He has accepted an offer from St John's College, Cambridge where he is studying Maths.

Finally, 11 students from the Leaving Cert Class of 2024, George Beardsworth, Luca Bonnet, Donnacha Collins, Ben Cullinane, Eoghan Dunne, Jagat Gogineni, James Harrington, Tadgh O'Brien, Peter O'Shea, Lucas Kennedy and Fionn Kimber O'Shea, achieved an incredible 100% in the Higher Level Leaving Certificate Mathematics exam this year.

CAREERS EXHIBITION

The biennial Careers Exhibition took place in October and brought together Universities, professional bodies, organisations and practitioners to meet with and offer guidance for CBC students from Third to Sixth Year. The event is organised by the Parents Council in collaboration with the CBC Guidance and Counselling Department.

ZAMBIA IMMERSION PROJECT

In June, the Zambia Immersion Project team of 14 Fifth Year students and 3 teachers (Mr Steven Lynch, Ms Catherine Whelan and Ms Ciara McCormack) embarked on a life-changing two week Immersion to Mazabuka, the first trip since before the Covid pandemic. The project was undertaken with the support and assistance of SERVE. A busy year of rigorous preparation preceded the trip including the organisation of fundraising initiatives, culminating in the very successful Chaser event at the Clayton Silversprings Hotel.

Highlights of the trip included time spent in three schools, primary, post-primary and special education, where the team assisted with a number

of practical projects. Students were privileged to be able to spend time with, and learn from, local people whose attitude to life was so inspiring. As the two weeks came to an end, students had learned so much and felt fortunate to have had the opportunity



to experience such a vastly different environment.

The impact of this immersion will extend beyond the immediate community in Zambia. Not only did students develop resilience, adaptability, and a profound sense of gratitude, they learned to navigate challenges, work collaboratively, and communicate across cultural barriers. The students' journey to Zambia serves as a powerful reminder of the impact young people can have when they are empowered to serve and learn from the world around them. This amazing experience would not have been possible and as fulfilling without the steadfast support from the wider school community.

WELLBEING

On Saturday 11 May, an estimated 200 people assembled in the College at 4.00 a.m. for the inaugural CBC Darkness into Light Walk in support of Pieta House. Participants walked a 5km route through the streets of Cork City and returned to the school, where light refreshments were served. This was a wonderful opportunity for all members of the Preparatory and Secondary including pupils, parents, past pupils, extended family and staff to raise awareness of the work of Pieta and also promote the wellbeing of our own school community. Thanks to their generosity, this initiative raised in excess of €9,000.

The second Annual Wellbeing Week took place in October and featured a number of excellent presentations to individual year groups on wellbeing-related topics. SOCIAL JUSTICE – UN GENEVA AND ERI VISIT

This year, a select group of Fifth Year ambassadors, Kevin Cotter, Fionn Lane Kelly and Alex Healy Horgan, together with their teacher Mr. Edmond Hussey, had the remarkable opportunity to delve into the workings of the United Nations (UN) and its human rights mechanisms, thanks to the gracious hosting by Edmund Rice International (ERI), a distinguished nongovernmental organisation dedicated to promoting the rights of marginalised children and youth worldwide.

Students participated in the 55th session of the Human Rights Council at UN Headquarters, gaining experience of the multifaceted issues encompassing human rights. Witnessing countries articulating their recommendations during reviews underscored the diverse challenges and approaches to addressing issues such as gender-based violence, LGBTQ discrimination, and the death penalty. The participants also visited the International Red Cross Museum, where the interactive displays served as poignant reminders of the realities underpinning our advocacy efforts.



TY PLAY – THE FIELD

An outstanding production from start to finish, this year's TY play, The Field, was a credit to all involved and testament to the opportunities unique provided for sligug through the Transition Year programme. JONATHAN WALSH

The Br Reynolds Student of the Year Award is presented each year to the pupil who best embodies the spirit and philosophy of Christians. The award does not depend on academic ability, sporting success or pre-eminence in any particular area. It is not presented to a high achiever, in the narrow sense of the term.

The Student of the Year is a young man who serves as a role model for others in the school; who met the challenges of secondary school with courage, resilience and dignity; who took advantage of the opportunities afforded to him by CBC; and who possesses the traits that we seek to foster in all our pupils.

This year's recipient of the Br Reynolds Student of the Year Award is Jonathan Walsh.

Jonathan's time in CBC was marked by participation, service and achievement. From his earliest days in Christians he enjoyed the cut and thrust of the Debating Society and developed his skills year on year.

He was an European Youth Parliament delegate and a representative on the Rotary Youth Leadership Development Competition. Last May he won the prestigious Gold Medal debate here in the college, a fitting final accomplishment at the end of his journey in CBC. He did put his



eloquence to good use on one further occasion: on the day of the Leaving Cert results he was interviewed by RTE and impressed listeners with his articulacy, humour and maturity.

Jonathan is also a talented writer. In 2022 he was named Best Speaker and Speechwriter at the Action Aid National Speech Writing Final in Dublin and was twice runner-up in the Education Essay-Writing Competition Oxford. He also won the Five Lamps National Short Story competition. Commenting on his story 'Words' the adjudicators commented on his empathy, characterisation and engaging plot.

He represented CBC on the rugby pitch for six years and was an excellent role model for all players, striving to improve in every training session. Playing at outhalf he was tenacious in defence and inventive in attack and always gave 100%. He was clearly proud to wear the jersey and, win or lose, he walked off the pitch with his head held high.

However, this award is not presented to simply acknowledge Jonathan's achievements. This award is about character. Jonathan was always keen to give back to the college. As a Debating coach he passed on his skills, enthusiasm and dedication to those who now carry the torch. He was elected to the Student Council in 2020 and represented his year group in discussions with the management of the college. In 2022 he was selected as a member of our Meitheal Youth Leadership Team. In this role he worked to support First Year students as they sought to adapt to life in secondary school. As important as organising events such as soccer tournaments was, it was Jonathan's amiable and gentle manner that was appreciated by the younger boys.

In such ways, he is a great role model for all the pupils of the college.

Jonathan is a credit to his family, his college and himself. The qualities he displayed while in CBC will stand to him throughout his life, whatever path he chooses. He is a worthy recipient of the Br Reynolds Student of the Year award and someone we will always be proud to call 'a Christians boy'.
