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LEAVING CERTS ARE A CLASS ACT

In a year when so many aspects of our lives were impacted by the challenges of Covid-19, the achievements of the Leaving Certificate Class of 2021 served as a fitting reward for the hard work and dedication of our final year students.

CBC students have long enjoyed an unparalleled record in State examinations and this year has proven to be no exception. Eight students were awarded the maximum 625 points, including Alex Lynch who attained 8 H1 grades. Two students, Stephen Hayden and Hugh O'Sullivan were awarded 7 H1s. Twenty pupils attained over 600 points. 48% of pupils were awarded over 500 points, with pupils attaining an average of 478 points. Individual H1 rates across all subjects told their own story of dogged determination and a refusal to let the challenges of the pandemic have an adverse impact on their goals.

Friday 3 September was a day to celebrate our pupils' outstanding achievements but also to pay tribute to our teaching staff for their commitment and professionalism throughout.



The results achieved this year are testament to the resilience and strength of character exhibited by the Class of 2021. We hope that, as honoured graduates of the College, our motto 'Certa Bonum'

Certanum' will remain with them as they move on to the next stage of their journey and will continue to inspire them to fight the good fight in all that they do in life.

F1 in Schools is an international competition for Secondary School students in which teams have to design and manufacture a miniature car out of the official F1 model block using CAD/CAM design



tools. The cars are powered by CO2 cartridges and are attached to a track by a nylon wire. Teams have to create a team brand and advertise themselves through various media including social media. They raise money to fund all aspects of the competition through sponsorship from local companies. Two teams, Sting Racing and CSLR Racing, competed in the National Finals which were broadcast on TG4 in May. The current school year sees this activity going from strength to strength with seven teams going forward to this year's competition. LEARNING AND TEACHING

CBC is committed to ongoing innovation in Learning and Teaching. As January 2021 began with a national lockdown, CBC moved online with a full virtual timetable of live classes. The focus until the return to school in March for Leaving Certificate pupils and April for all other year groups, was on providing structure and routine for students and ensuring that important academic work could continue. Through the assistance of Year Heads and the Student Support and Wellbeing teams, a number of initiatives were introduced to support student wellbeing during these difficult times.

In support of Leaving Certificate students, last year saw the roll out of the Master Class programme, delivered online each weekend until the end of May with a full schedule of live sessions provided for each examination subject. Given the feedback from

students and parents last year, it was decided to embed this programme into the College's traditional offering for Leaving Certs going forward.

This year, a further innovation has been introduced in focused academic tracking, with every Leaving Cert student individually supported through the year with one-to-one meetings which assist pupils in taking stock of where they are, working with them to identify targets and strategies to achieve these targets. It is hoped that the programme, led by Year Heads Mr Tony Wall and Mr Tom Crowe with the support of the Guidance and Counselling Department, Learning and Teaching Committee and Senior Management, will provide important direction to assist pupils in taking stock of where they are and working with them to identify.

BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE

As work continues on the exciting College Development plan, it is hoped that the project will go to tender early in the new year.

The development will include a new five-storey schoolhouse running parallel to St Patrick's Hill consisting of a new library and digital suite as well as an auditorium, classrooms, Guidance Suite and canteen with viewing area overlooking the city. New indoor and outdoor social spaces will enhance the student experience. An extensive upgrade of the grounds will also take place. The development will provide significant additional improvements Preparatory School.

The 2500 square metre building been developed in has conjunction with award winning architects O'Donnell and Tuomey who were responsible for such projects as the UCC Glucksman Gallery, St Angela's College, the London School of Economics and the Central European University Budapest. The development was made possible on foot of the purchase of lands adjoining the school by CBC in recent years.

The development represents a huge investment in CBC for the future and ensures that the quality of learning and teaching in the College continues to be matched by facilities of the highest calibre.



BR REYNOLDS STUDENT OF THE YEAR 2020-2021

The Br Reynolds Student of the Year Award is presented each year to the pupil who best embodies the spirit and philosophy of Christians. The award does not depend on academic ability, sporting success or pre-eminence in any particular area. It is not presented to a high achiever, in the narrow sense of the term.

The Student of the Year is a young man who serves as a role model for others in the school; who met the challenges of secondary school with courage, resilience and dignity; who took advantage of the opportunities afforded to him by CBC; and who possesses the traits that we seek to foster in all our pupils.

This year's recipient of the Br Reynolds Student of the Year Award is Eoin Palmer.

As a member of the college's Misneach Team Eoin made a massive contribution to the organisation and smooth running of school events. His energetic and unflappable approach made light of obstacles as they arose and he showed significant leaderships skills, particularly during challenging moments. His instinctive understanding of how to get the best out of a team was remarkable to see in such a young man and resulted in a level of synergy that ensured the success of numerous events across the school year.

SCHOOL CLOSURE JANUARY 2021

Following the Level 5 government directive during the Christmas break for all schools nationally to remain closed until 1st February due to the COVID 19 pandemic, CBC Preparatory School commenced its remote learning programme for all students. All class teachers engaged with students via Google Classroom and we were delighted to see the boys eager to get back to their schoolwork following the extended Christmas holidays. This year, classes were offered regular Live ZOOM session with their class teachers and classmates - these sessions proved to be very successful with students as teachers came up with innovative ways to sustain engagement with classwork. Weekly themed bingo games, art demonstrations, construction creations, dress up sessions, STEM challenges, dance offs and scavenger hunts were just some of the activities that accompanied more traditional teaching of the core subjects online. Teachers also made use of the thumbs up/thumbs down method of communication as well as using mini whiteboards to ensure all students remained involved and engaged in lessons.

Throughout the school closure, teachers also attended regular CPD sessions via ZOOM to ensure that they were up to date on ways in which they could engage students and bring the curriculum to life while students remained at home.

Mr Lynch arranged a superb programme to encourage the boys to stay active at home. Making use of the wealth of sporting talent at CBC, members of the Senior rugby and hurling teams as well as some of our 4th year coaches prepared videos for the Prep School boys to help them work on their own sporting skills at home. This was a fantastic initiative and was very well received by all members of the Preparatory School community.






WORLD BOOK DAY CHALLENGES

HISTORY PROJECT 2021

To mark the centenary commemoration which took place nationwide during 2021 of the Irish War of Independence our history classes in Third. Fourth. Fifth and Sixth Class concentrated on this revolutionary period in Irish history and on the foundation of the Irish Free State in 1921. In addition, the boys in the four classes were tasked with producing a personal project on 'Cork City and County during War of Independence Years 1919-1921'. The pupils were asked to research details of events which took place in the Cork area during this critical time in Irish history. In particular, the boys were asked to do some primary research within their own family and to seek out any connections within their own family with the period. The boys in the four classes produced some outstanding projects where many family connections were indeed established. For example, Oliver Bailey in Sixth Class, actually recorded an interview with his family relative Ms Fidelma Collins, a grand-niece of Michael Collins. The boys presented their projects in class.

SPORT AT THE PREP SCHOOL



OCTOBER 1992



This photograph - from the archives of the then Cork Examiner – proudly hangs next to the principal's office in Christian Brothers College Preparatory School.

An eager observer might notice 55 well-dressed and excited boys, the more observant, might recognise a fresh faced Micheál Martin and his wife Mary on the annual visit of the Lord Mayor of Cork to CBC. A visit which was accompanied by the customary Lord Mayor's announcement of a half day, a long standing tradition in Cork and perhaps the reason some of the smiles in the photo are so broad.

The boys are stewarded by Brother McGrath and Brother Davis, both of whom served as the last of the Christian Brothers at the helm of the Preparatory School and instilled the CBC ethos and mentality in

the boys who passed through the school's doors.

As we momentarily stood still in 1992 to have our photo taken with the Lord Mayor, a very different world to today, was moving around us. The Maastricht Treaty was signed, founding the European Union; A newcomer, Bill Clinton was at the forefront of the American Presidential race; 58 Irish Athletes set sail for Barcelona to compete in the Summer Olympics and perhaps more interestingly to us at the time of the photograph, Turner Broadcasting System had just launched Cartoon Network.

Now, these young boys are young men, some of whom have children the age we were in 1992. They have diverse careers, leaving their mark on innumerable industries and some live further from

Cork than junior infants geography led us to believe was possible. Our then Lord Mayor is now our Taoiseach, Brothers are no longer a common sight in the corridors and the Primary School is steered by Dr. Jordan and the teachers, some of whom I remember from my days in the old school tie.

Even after 29 years, it would not be uncommon to find me standing next to some of these classmates. Though, we've graduated from uniform to suits, what subsists, is that being a Christians boy has always served us well.
